
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Leader in Me

During September we will be working to deepen our understanding of **Habit 1: Be Proactive**.

Here is some of the language your child will be learning: You're in Charge. I am a responsible person. I take initiative. I choose my actions, attitudes, and moods. I do not blame others for my wrong actions. I do the right thing without being asked, even when no one is looking.



To help your child be proactive at home, you could get them to help lay out their uniform for school the next day and pack everything they need in their school bag.

Our Support for Learning workers will be awarding house points to children they spot being 'proactive' in the playground at break times.
