




Inclusion and Equality




Leadership

Eight children trained as Outdoor Learning Leaders and now support sessions throughout the school. Twelve pupils undertook Education Scotland 'Young Leader of Learning' training to empower them to be more actively involved in our ongoing self-evaluation activities. They will now begin to promote ways that our pupils can be involved in school improvement activities in our own school.

Thanks to incredibly generous donations from our parents and community partners we were gifted £1500 worth of culturally diverse library books which reflect the children in our school community. The children now have access to books featuring characters that look like them and come from families like theirs.
